Sarah Agnes "Sally" Supple died Tuesday December 5, 2006 in Chester, CT. She was born in Hartford the daughter of Thomas David Supple, Sr. and his wife Sarah A. McNaney. She lived in West Hartford and was a lifelong summer resident on the Cape in East Dennis, MA. She retired from ITT Hartford's Office Management Department, where she supervised the Risk Experience Department and was on the first women to travel as a Field Assistant. During WWII she was a volunteer, trained Red Cross Nurses Aid at St Francis Hospital. She was also called to the then Municipal Hospital to serve burn patients of the Hartford Circus Fire. She also cared for the burn victims of the SSS Franklin at the Windsor Locks Airport, when it was used by the government. She was a member of St Thomas the Apostle Church, West Hartford, and Our Lady of the Cape Church in Brewster, MA. She is survived by her five nieces and nephews: Vincent A. Supple, Jr. and his wife Jane B. of Sarasota, FL., William T. Supple and wife Marge Fuller of Haddam, Barbara Supple Moriconi of East Dennis, MA, Janet Supple Bilodeau of Avon, Jacqueline Supple Shea and husband Walter Shea, Sr. of Fl. and Hyannis, MA, and many grand and great grand nieces and nephews. She was predeceased by her brothers and sisters-in-law: Vincent A. Supple, Sr. and his wife Helen Cosker Supple, Thomas D. Supple, Jr. and his wife Mary Darling, William J.
