Anne Scott, daughter of the late Thomas F. and Anna Keenan Scott, died Saturday, June 7, 2008, at St. Francis Hospital. Born in Hartford, Anne resided in West Hartford since 1943. Anne was a graduate of Bulkeley High School in Hartford. She attended Mt. Holyoke College and graduated from St. Joseph College with a B.S. degree in psychology. She completed her graduate study at the University of Connecticut receiving a Masters Degree in Social Work. Making a career in social work, Anne was employed in the State of Connecticut Social Service Department for 29 years as a case worker and later, as a case supervisor. When the department opened its Manchester office, she was the case supervisor in charge of that office. She left this assignment to accept the position of consultant in the department's division of staff services. Following her retirement, Anne engaged in volunteer work at St. Mary's Home in West Hartford. She was a communicant of St. Thomas the Apostle Church in West Hartford. Anne was a member of the St. Thomas the Apostle Women's Club and of the St. Agnes Guild. Anne was predeceased by her sister Edna Scott. She is survived by her cousins William Keenan of West Hartford and Claire Carroll of Newington, her Goddaughter, Sybil Eve Bartone, many second cousins and good friends including Terry D'Esopo, Kay Havens, and Vera O'Donovan. The funeral will be Wednesday at 9:30 a.m. from the Molloy Funeral Home, 906 Farmington Ave., West Hartford, with a mass of Christian Burial at 10:00 a.m. at St. Thomas the Apostle Church, 872 Farmington Ave., West Hartford.
