Stan Loomis, 88, of West Hartford, died peacefully, Tuesday, May 22, 2012, at Brookdale Place in West Hartford. Stan was a retired Sales Engineer who enjoyed a successful career with large companies including McGraw Edison and Westinghouse. Born on July 3, 1923 in Montrose, Pennsylvania, he was the son of the late Stanley and Katherine Loomis. Loomis, now living in West Hartford, CT, his two beloved daughters, Jean, of Monmouth, Maine, Barbara, of West Hartford, CT, two sons-in-law, Bruce MacDonald and John Gallacher.
