Thomas Andrew Kashnig, 50, beloved husband of Kara Corcoran and loving father of Savanna and Camille passed away unexpectedly on Saturday, November 20, 2010. Tom was a gentle giant. His compassion and tender heart were well-known to all who knew him. His wife, Kara, and daughters, Savanna and Camille were his true treasures. He always spoke of them with pride and a smile. Tommy was a dedicated environmentalist and a rescuer of animals and plants. He was a long time member of The Nature Conservancy and the Sierra Club. He was also an Eagle Scout. Tom was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota, the son of Lois Kashnig and the late William G. Kashnig. He lived in Connecticut for most of his life and graduated from Conard High School in West Hartford where he developed a number of life-long friendships. His concern for the environment and appreciation for the beauty of the natural world led him to study landscape architecture and horticulture. He graduated from the University of Connecticut and earned degrees in both fields. He also leaves behind a large extended family including brothers, sisters, the Corcorans, nieces, nephews and many good friends who were all very dear to him. We will all miss his caring ways. A memorial service will be held on Saturday, November 27, 2010, at 10 a.m. at St. Peter Claver Church, 47 Pleasant St., West Hartford. A private burial will follow the mass.
