William C. Doran, 85, died Saturday Dec. 19, 2009 at Hartford Hospital. Born in West Hartford, the son of the late, William J. and Marion Weir Doran, he grew up in Hartford graduating from Bulkeley High School in 1942. Bill served with the U.S. Marine Corps during WW II in the Pacific Theater of Operations. He fought in the battles of Roi Namur, Tinian, Saipan and Iwo Jima. He was a member of the Marine Corps League, the Iwo Jima Survivors Association, VFW, American Legion, and Elks Club. He worked as a salesman with Nabisco for 28 years and was fondly referred to as the Cookie Man . He and his beloved late wife Barbara Quinn Doran lived in West Hartford since 1957 surrounded by family and a host of great friends. He is survived by his son and daughter-in-law William C. and Deborah Sardilli Doran, Jr. of West Hartford, his grandson Connor, extended family and countless friends. Bill has personally touched many lives through his kindness, love of life and compassion for others. He spent the later years of his life, serving the veteran community, speaking to students about his military experiences and expressing his appreciation for today s soldiers.
