William C. Ladish, 74, of Avon, the husband of Nancy Lengyel Ladish, died Monday, December 10, 2007, at John Dempsey Hospital in Farmington. Born in Hartford, the son of the late John Edward and Mary Farrell Ladish, he had lived in East Granby for over 25 years, moving to Avon 8 years ago. Bill was a graduate of Loomis School in Windsor and St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, MD. He retired from the Travelers Ins. Co. in 1993 enjoying his avocations golf and baseball. Besides his wife Nancy, he is survived by his daughter Gretchen Ladish of London, England. His brother John Ladish and his wife Joanne of New Kensington, PA, the Rev. Robert Ladish of New Preston, Nancy Kendall and her husband Leonard of Simsbury, his brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law, Paul Fardy and his wife Judith of Point Lookout, NY, Robert Richardell and his wife Marybeth of Old Saybrook; his niece Marjorie Rice of West Hartford and his Kendall and Ladish nieces and nephews also survive him. 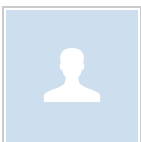

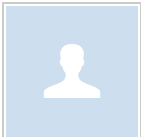
